13 14 15	The Mayor and City Council of Baltimore shall have full power and authority to exercise all of the powers heretofore or hereafter granted to it by the Constitution of Maryland or by any Public General or Public Local Laws of the State of Maryland; and in particular, without limitation upon the foregoing, shall have power by ordinance, or such other method as may be provided for in its Charter, subject to the provisions of said Constitution and Public General Laws:
19 20	(63) (a) (1) To establish, by ordinance, not more than six community benefits district management authorities, including the Charles Village Community Benefits District AND MIDTOWN BENEFITS DISTRICT, within the City to provide services consistent with paragraph (2) of this subsection to the business interests and residents of the proposed district.
24	[(h) (1) The General Assembly shall review and determine the desirability of continuing the existence of each community benefits district established under this section every 4 years beginning with the regular legislative session of 2000.
26 27	(2) If the continuing existence of a community benefits district is not approved:
28 29	(i) The district shall cease to exist at the end of the city's fiscal year in which approval was not granted; and
