A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Crimes - Harboring a Fugitive

- 3 FOR the purpose of modifying the definition of "fugitive" for the purpose of making
- 4 the term, as it pertains to a certain crime relating to harboring a fugitive, apply
- 5 to individuals for whose arrest a valid felony warrant has been issued, whether
- 6 or not the warrant is issued under State law.
- 7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
- 8 Article 27 Crimes and Punishments
- 9 Section 268E(d) and 268F
- 10 Annotated Code of Maryland
- 11 (1996 Replacement Volume and 1999 Supplement)
- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 Article 27 - Crimes and Punishments

- 15 268E.
- 16 (d) "Fugitive" means any individual for whose arrest a VALID felony warrant 17 has been issued [under Maryland law].
- 18 268F.
- 19 (a) Whoever harbors any fugitive, so as to prevent his discovery and arrest,
- 20 after notice or knowledge of the fact that a VALID felony warrant has been issued for
- 21 the apprehension of that fugitive, and after notice that harboring that fugitive is a
- 22 punishable offense, is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined not more than
- 23 \$1,000 or imprisoned not more than one year, or both.
- 24 (b) Whoever knowingly harbors a fugitive who is avoiding prosecution,
- 25 custody, or confinement after conviction of a felony is guilty of a misdemeanor and
- 26 shall be fined not more than \$1,000 or imprisoned not more than 1 year, or both.

- 1 (c) This section does not apply when the warrant is for a traffic offense.
- 2 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 3 October 1, 2000.
