- 24 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 25 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 **Article - Transportation** 2 16-113. 3 (d) Notwithstanding the licensee's driving record, the Administration (1) shall impose an hour restriction on a provisional driver's license issued to an 5 applicant under the age of 18. The restriction under this subsection shall limit the holder of a 6 (2) 7 provisional license to driving unsupervised only between the hours of [5] 6 a.m. and 8 [12 midnight] 11 P.M. This subsection does not preclude the holder of a provisional license 10 from driving between the hours of [12 midnight] 11 P.M. and [5] 6 a.m. the following 11 day if the licensee is: 12 (i) Accompanied and supervised by a licensed driver who is at least 13 21 years old; 14 (ii) Driving to or from or in the course of the licensee's employment; 15 (iii) Driving to or from a school class or official school activity; Driving to or from an organized volunteer program; or 16 (iv) 17 Driving to or from an opportunity to participate in an athletic (v) 18 event or related training session. 19 (4) The hour restriction and the supervision requirement under this 20 subsection expire on the date the holder of the provisional license turns 18 years of 21 age. 22 NOTWITHSTANDING THE LICENSEE'S DRIVING RECORD, THE 23 ADMINISTRATION SHALL IMPOSE A RESTRICTION ON EACH PROVISIONAL DRIVER'S 24 LICENSE PROHIBITING THE LICENSEE FROM OPERATING A MOTOR VEHICLE IF: THE MOTOR VEHICLE IS OCCUPIED BY MORE THAN 2 25 (I) 26 PASSENGERS UNDER THE AGE OF 21; OR 27 SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE DRIVER (II)28 AND EACH PASSENGER IN THE MOTOR VEHICLE ARE NOT RESTRAINED BY A SEAT 29 BELT OR, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 22-412.2 OF THIS ARTICLE, BY A CHILD SAFETY 30 SEAT. 31 (2)IT IS NOT A VIOLATION OF THE RESTRICTION UNDER PARAGRAPH 32 (1)(II) OF THIS SUBSECTION IF AN INDIVIDUAL COVERED BY A MEDICAL EXCEPTION 33 UNDER § 22-412.2(F) OR § 22-412.3(D) AND (E) OF THIS ARTICLE IS NOT RESTRAINED. THE RESTRICTIONS UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION

- 2 (a) In this section, "offense" means A LICENSE RESTRICTION VIOLATION
- 3 UNDER § 16-113(D) OR (D-1) OF THIS TITLE OR a moving violation committed by an
- 4 individual who:
- 5 (1) Holds a provisional license under § 16-111 of this title; and
- 6 (2) Was convicted of the violation.
- 7 (b) The sanctions under this section are in addition to any other penalty or 8 sanctions that might apply as a result of a moving violation.
- 9 (c) The Administration:
- 10 (1) For a first offense, shall require the offender to attend a driver
- 11 improvement program under § 16-212 of this subtitle;
- 12 (2) For a second offense, may suspend the offender's provisional license
- 13 for up to 30 days; and
- 14 (3) For a third or subsequent offense, may suspend or revoke the
- 15 offender's provisional license for up to 180 days.
- 16 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, notwithstanding Section
- 17 1 of this Act, any individual who holds a provisional driver's license on September 30,
- 18 2000, is subject to the license restrictions in effect on that date as long as the
- 19 provisional license remains in effect and is not affected by the changes in restrictions
- 20 applicable to provisional licenses enacted under Section 1 of this Act.
- 21 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 22 October 1, 2000.
