- **HOUSE BILL 358** 1 (2) (I) "ASSOCIATED FUNERARY OBJECT" MEANS AN ITEM OF HUMAN 2 MANUFACTURE OR USE THAT IS INTENTIONALLY PLACED WITH HUMAN REMAINS AT 3 THE TIME OF INTERMENT IN A BURIAL SITE OR PLACED LATER AS A PART OF A 4 DEATH RITE OR CEREMONY OF A CULTURE, RELIGION, OR GROUP. "ASSOCIATED FUNERARY OBJECT" INCLUDES ANY 5 (II)6 GRAVESTONE, MONUMENT, TOMB, OR OTHER STRUCTURE IN OR DIRECTLY 7 ASSOCIATED WITH A BURIAL SITE. "BURIAL SITE" MEANS ANY NATURAL OR PREPARED PHYSICAL 8 (3)(I)9 LOCATION, WHETHER ORIGINALLY LOCATED BELOW, ON, OR ABOVE THE SURFACE 10 OF THE EARTH, INTO WHICH HUMAN REMAINS OR ASSOCIATED FUNERARY OBJECTS 11 ARE DEPOSITED AS A PART OF A DEATH RITE OR CEREMONY OF ANY CULTURE. 12 RELIGION, OR GROUP. (II)"BURIAL SITE" INCLUDES THE HUMAN REMAINS AND 14 ASSOCIATED FUNERARY OBJECTS THAT RESULT FROM A SHIPWRECK OR ACCIDENT 15 AND ARE INTENTIONALLY LEFT TO REMAIN AT THE SITE. 16 (4) "PERMANENT CEMETERY" MEANS A CEMETERY THAT IS OWNED BY: A CEMETERY COMPANY REGULATED UNDER TITLE 5 OF THE 17 (I)18 BUSINESS REGULATION ARTICLE; 19 (II)A NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION; OR 20 (III)THE STATE. 21 EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, A (B) (1) 22 PERSON MAY NOT REMOVE OR ATTEMPT TO REMOVE HUMAN REMAINS OR 23 ASSOCIATED FUNERARY OBJECTS FROM ANY BURIAL SITE IN THE STATE. A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A 25 MISDEMEANOR AND SHALL BE SENTENCED TO THE PENITENTIARY FOR NOT LESS 26 THAN 5 OR MORE THAN 15 YEARS ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO A FINE OF NOT 27 MORE THAN \$10,000 OR IMPRISONMENT IN THE PENITENTIARY FOR NOT MORE THAN 28 5 YEARS OR BOTH. SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS SECTION, THE 29 (C) 30 STATE'S ATTORNEY OF A COUNTY OR BALTIMORE CITY MAY AUTHORIZE IN WRITING 31 THE REMOVAL OF HUMAN REMAINS OR ASSOCIATED FUNERARY OBJECTS FROM ANY 32 BURIAL SITE IN THE STATE'S ATTORNEY'S JURISDICTION:

- FOR THE PURPOSE OF DETERMINING WHETHER THE HUMAN (2) 36 REMAINS WERE INTERRED ERRONEOUSLY;
- 37 (3) FOR THE PURPOSE OF REBURIAL; OR

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(4) FOR MEDICAL OR SCIENTIFIC EXAMINATION OR STUDY, AS 2 PERMITTED BY LAW. (D) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (4) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE 4 STATE'S ATTORNEY FOR A COUNTY OR BALTIMORE CITY SHALL REQUIRE A PERSON 5 REQUESTING THE AUTHORIZATION TO PERMANENTLY RELOCATE HUMAN REMAINS 6 OR ASSOCIATED FUNERARY OBJECTS FROM A BURIAL SITE TO ALLOW ANOTHER 7 PERMITTED USE IN THE STATE'S ATTORNEY'S JURISDICTION TO PUBLISH A NOTICE 8 OF THE PROPOSED RELOCATION IN A NEWSPAPER OF GENERAL CIRCULATION IN 9 BALTIMORE CITY OR IN THE COUNTY WHERE THE BURIAL SITE IS LOCATED. THE NOTICE SHALL BE PUBLISHED IN THE NEWSPAPER AT LEAST 10 (2) 11 ONCE A WEEK FOR AT LEAST 3 CONSECUTIVE WEEKS ONE TIME. 12 (3) THE NOTICE SHALL CONTAIN: 13 A STATEMENT THAT AUTHORIZATION FROM THE STATE'S (I) 14 ATTORNEY IS BEING REQUESTED TO REMOVE HUMAN REMAINS OR ASSOCIATED 15 FUNERARY OBJECTS FROM A BURIAL SITE; (II)THE PURPOSE FOR WHICH THE AUTHORIZATION IS BEING 16 17 REQUESTED; (III)THE LOCATION OF THE BURIAL SITE, INCLUDING THE TAX MAP 19 AND PARCEL NUMBER OR LIBER FOLIO LIBER AND FOLIO NUMBER; AND (IV) ALL KNOWN PERTINENT INFORMATION CONCERNING THE 21 BURIAL SITE, INCLUDING THE NAMES OF THE PERSONS WHOSE HUMAN REMAINS 22 ARE INTERRED IN THE BURIAL SITE, IF KNOWN. 23 FOR GOOD CAUSE THE STATE'S ATTORNEY MAY AUTHORIZE THE 24 TEMPORARY RELOCATION OF HUMAN REMAINS OR ASSOCIATED FUNERARY OBJECTS 25 FROM A BURIAL SITE NOTWITHSTANDING THE NOTICE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS 26 SUBSECTION. IF THE PERSON REQUESTING THE AUTHORIZATION THEREAFTER 27 INTENDS TO PERMANENTLY RELOCATE THE REMAINS, THE PERSON SHALL 28 PROMPTLY PUBLISH THE NOTICE AS REQUIRED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION. THE PERSON REQUESTING THE AUTHORIZATION FROM THE 30 STATE'S ATTORNEY SHALL PAY THE COST OF PUBLISHING THE NOTICE. AFTER RECEIVING PROOF OF THE PUBLICATION REQUIRED 31 (5)(6) 32 UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION AND 15 DAYS HAVING EXPIRED 33 BEGINNING WITH THE DATE OF THE THIRD SUCCESSIVE AFTER THE DATE OF THE 34 PUBLICATION OF THE REOUIRED NOTICE. THE STATE'S ATTORNEY MAY AUTHORIZE 35 THE REMOVAL OF THE HUMAN REMAINS OR ASSOCIATED FUNERARY OBJECTS FROM 36 THE BURIAL SITE. 37 THIS SUBSECTION MAY NOT BE CONSTRUED TO DELAY,

- 3 (7) (8) FOR A KNOWN, BUT NOT NECESSARILY DOCUMENTED,
- 4 UNMARKED BURIAL SITE, THE PERSON REQUESTING AUTHORIZATION FOR THE
- 5 REMOVAL OF HUMAN REMAINS <u>OR ASSOCIATED FUNERARY OBJECTS</u> FROM THE
- 6 BURIAL SITE HAS THE BURDEN OF PROVING BY ARCHAEOLOGICAL EXCAVATION OR
- 7 OTHER ACCEPTABLE METHODS THE PRECISE LOCATION AND BOUNDARIES OF THE
- 8 BURIAL SITE.
- 9 (E) THIS SECTION MAY NOT BE CONSTRUED TO PREEMPT THE NEED FOR A
- 10 PERMIT REQUIRED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE UNDER
- 11 § 4-215 OF THE HEALTH GENERAL ARTICLE TO REMOVE HUMAN REMAINS FROM A
- 12 BURIAL SITE.
- 13 (F) (1) ANY HUMAN REMAINS THAT ARE REMOVED FROM A BURIAL SITE IN
- 14 ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION SHALL BE REINTERRED:
- 15 (I) 1. IN A PERMANENT CEMETERY THAT PROVIDES PERPETUAL
- 16 CARE; OR
- 17 2. IN A PLACE OTHER THAN A PERMANENT CEMETERY WITH
- 18 THE AGREEMENT OF, OR AT THE REQUEST OF, A PERSON IN INTEREST AS DEFINED
- 19 IN § 14-121(A)(4) OF THE REAL PROPERTY ARTICLE; AND
- 20 (II) IN THE PRESENCE OF:

- 27 THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION SHALL BE ENTERED INTO THE LOCAL BURIAL
- 28 SITES INVENTORY OR, IF NO LOCAL BURIAL SITES INVENTORY EXISTS, INTO

- 3 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION, "ASSOCIATED FUNERARY OBJECT" MEANS AN ITEM
- 4 OF HUMAN MANUFACTURE OR USE THAT IS INTENTIONALLY PLACED WITH HUMAN
- 5 REMAINS AT THE TIME OF INTERMENT IN A BURIAL SITE OR PLACED LATER AS PART
- 6 OF A DEATH RITE OR CEREMONY OF A CULTURE, RELIGION, OR GROUP.
- 7 (2) "ASSOCIATED FUNERARY OBJECT" INCLUDES ANY GRAVESTONE,
- 8 MONUMENT, TOMB, OR OTHER STRUCTURE IN OR DIRECTLY ASSOCIATED WITH A
- 9 BURIAL SITE.
- 10 (a) Any person who wilfully destroys, mutilates, defaces, injures, or
- 11 removes any tomb, monument, gravestone, AN ASSOCIATED FUNERARY OBJECT or
- 12 other structure placed in any cemetery, or any building, wall, fence, railing, or other
- 13 work, for the use, protection, or ornamentation of any cemetery in this State is guilty
- 14 of a misdemeanor and shall be fined not more than \$5,000 \$10,000, or imprisoned for
- 15 not more than 3 5 years, or both.
- 16 (b) (C) Any person who wilfully destroys, cuts, breaks, or removes any tree,
- 17 plant, or shrub in any cemetery in this State, or who is found guilty of indecent or
- 18 disorderly conduct within said limits, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be
- 19 fined not more than \$500, or imprisoned for not more than 2 years, or both.
- 20 (D) Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit the removal of
- 21 the remains of any human body, or of any monument, gravestone, or other marker
- 22 ASSOCIATED FUNERARY OBJECT from an abandoned cemetery, provided that the
- 23 prior consent in writing of the State's Attorney of the county or of Baltimore City shall
- 24 have been secured and provided further that such remains, monuments, gravestone,
- 25 or other marker is OR ASSOCIATED FUNERARY OBJECTS ARE placed in an accessible
- 26 place in a permanent cemetery.
- 27 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 28 October 1, 2000.
