- **HOUSE BILL 358** (2)THE NOTICE SHALL BE PUBLISHED IN THE NEWSPAPER AT LEAST 2 ONCE A WEEK FOR AT LEAST 3 CONSECUTIVE WEEKS ONE TIME. 3 (3) THE NOTICE SHALL CONTAIN: A STATEMENT THAT AUTHORIZATION FROM THE STATE'S (I) 5 ATTORNEY IS BEING REQUESTED TO REMOVE HUMAN REMAINS OR ASSOCIATED 6 FUNERARY OBJECTS FROM A BURIAL SITE; THE PURPOSE FOR WHICH THE AUTHORIZATION IS BEING 7 (II)8 REQUESTED; (III)THE LOCATION OF THE BURIAL SITE. INCLUDING THE TAX MAP 10 AND PARCEL NUMBER OR LIBER-FOLIO LIBER AND FOLIO NUMBER; AND ALL KNOWN PERTINENT INFORMATION CONCERNING THE 12 BURIAL SITE, INCLUDING THE NAMES OF THE PERSONS WHOSE HUMAN REMAINS 13 ARE INTERRED IN THE BURIAL SITE, IF KNOWN. 14 FOR GOOD CAUSE THE STATE'S ATTORNEY MAY AUTHORIZE THE 15 TEMPORARY RELOCATION OF HUMAN REMAINS OR ASSOCIATED FUNERARY OBJECTS 16 FROM A BURIAL SITE NOTWITHSTANDING THE NOTICE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS 17 SUBSECTION. IF THE PERSON REQUESTING THE AUTHORIZATION THEREAFTER 18 INTENDS TO PERMANENTLY RELOCATE THE REMAINS, THE PERSON SHALL 19 PROMPTLY PUBLISH THE NOTICE AS REQUIRED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION. THE PERSON REQUESTING THE AUTHORIZATION FROM THE 21 STATE'S ATTORNEY SHALL PAY THE COST OF PUBLISHING THE NOTICE. - 6 disorderly conduct within said limits, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be
- 7 fined not more than \$500, or imprisoned for not more than 2 years, or both.
