3 (2) SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, NOTIFY A LAW
4 ENFORCEMENT AGENCY IN THE COUNTY WHERE THE DISCOVERY WAS MADE OF THE
5 PRESENCE AND EXACT LOCATION OF THE DISCOVERY SITE WITHIN 24 HOURS OF THE
6 TIME OF DISCOVERY.

7 (C) THE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY SHALL NOTIFY THE MARYLAND8 HISTORICAL TRUST ABOUT THE DISCOVERY OF HUMAN REMAINS IF:

9 (1) THE DISCOVERY WAS MADE DURING AN INVESTIGATION DIRECTED 10 BY A PROFESSIONAL ARCHAEOLOGIST IN ACCORDANCE WITH FEDERAL STANDARDS 11 PROVIDED IN 36 CFR PART 61, APPENDIX A; OR

(2) THE HUMAN REMAINS OR THE DISTURBED BURIAL SITE IS

15 (D) THE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY IN THE COUNTY WHERE THE

(2) INSPECT, OR HAVE INSPECTED BY AN AUTHORIZED AGENT, THE

POSSIBLE FROM READILY AVAILABLE INFORMATION, THE AGE AND ANY OTHER
IDENTIFYING INFORMATION OF THE REMAINS OR BURIAL SITE;

30 (3) ASSIST IN PREVENTING OR MITIGATING ANY FURTHER DAMAGE TO
31 OR DISTURBANCE OF THE HUMAN REMAINS OR THE BURIAL SITE, INCLUDING

34 (4) RECORD THE LOCATION OF THE BURIAL SITE IN THE LOCAL BURIAL

3 (G) THE FINAL DISPOSITION AND TREATMENT OF THE DISCOVERED HUMAN 4 REMAINS OR DISTURBED BURIAL SITE SHALL BE IN ACCORDANCE WITH STATE LAW.

5 (H) A PERSON WHO WILLFULLY VIOLATES SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION
6 IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO A FINE NOT
7 EXCEEDING \$500 OR IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 6 MONTHS OR BOTH.

8 (I) A COUNTY OR BALTIMORE CITY MAY ESTABLISH A LOCAL BURIAL SITES
9 ADVISORY BOARD TO MAINTAIN A CURRENT INVENTORY OF BURIAL SITES WITHIN
10 THEIR JURISDICTION AND TO SERVE AS A SOURCE OF INFORMATION AND
11 ASSISTANCE REGARDING BURIAL SITES AND THE DISPOSITION OF HUMAN REMAINS
12 AND ASSOCIATED FUNERARY OBJECTS.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is not intended to
limit the authority of the legislative body of a county, including Baltimore City, or a
municipal corporation to provide or encourage the protection of burial sites in
accordance with State law.
