A person who fails to comply with the relief granted in an ex parte order 16 (a) under § 4-505(a)(2)(i), (ii), (iii), (iv), or (v) of this subtitle or in a protective order under 17 18 § 4-506(d)(1), (2), (3), (4), or (5) of this subtitle is guilty of a misdemeanor and on 19 conviction is subject, for each offense, to:

20 for a first offense, a fine not exceeding \$1,000 or imprisonment not (1)21 exceeding 90 days or both; and

22 for a second or subsequent offense, a fine not exceeding \$2,500 or (2)23 imprisonment not exceeding 1 year or both.
