(m) (1) 21 (3)(i) The State's Attorney may appoint: [A deputy State's Attorney] UP TO TWO DEPUTY STATE'S 22 1. 23 ATTORNEYS; and 24 Whatever assistant State's Attorneys that are authorized 2. 25 by the County Executive and County Council.

(ii) All appointees serve at the State's Attorney's pleasure. The
salaries and compensation of such persons shall be provided by the County Executive
and County Council. The deputy State's [Attorney] ATTORNEYS and the assistant
State's Attorneys have the same legal powers as the State's Attorney to represent the
State before grand juries and in the trial of criminal proceedings.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 7 October 1, 2000.
