1 AN ACT concerning

2 Potomac River Protection Act

- 3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from constructing or blasting in the Potomac
- 4 River under certain circumstances; prohibiting the Secretary of the
- 5 Environment from issuing a waterway construction permit to construct a water
- 6 intake pipe in the Potomac River unless certain circumstances exist; requiring
- 7 the Secretary of the Environment to submit certain reports to the General
- 8 Assembly; prohibiting the Secretary of the Environment from issuing certain
