BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 5 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 6 **Article - State Personnel and Pensions** 7 25-201. 8 Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, this subtitle applies (a) 9 only to: 10 (1)correctional officers serving in any of the first six job classifications; 11 and 12 (2)security attendants at Clifton T. Perkins Hospital Center. 13 This subtitle does not apply to an employee of the Baltimore City Jail as of (b) 14 June 30, 1991, who: 15 became an employee of the Baltimore City Detention Center on July (1)16 1, 1991; and 17 (2)who did not elect to become a member of the Correctional Officers' 18 Retirement System on that date. 19 25-303. 20 Eligibility service for a member consists of service credit: 21 (1)for employment as a member; 22 regained under § 25-304 of this subtitle by a member who redeposits (2)23 accumulated contributions previously withdrawn; transferred from a retirement or pension system under Title 37 of 24 (3)25 this article or Title 31, Subtitle 1 of this article; (4) for military service as provided in Title 38 of this article; [or] 26 27 (5)purchased under this subtitle; OR TRANSFERRED FROM THE EMPLOYEES' PENSION SYSTEM FOR AN 28 (6)29 INDIVIDUAL WHO WAS VESTED BUT WHOSE MEMBERSHIP IN THE EMPLOYEES'

2 (A) A MEMBER WHO IS A FORMER MEMBER OF THE EMPLOYEES' PENSION 3 SYSTEM WHO WAS VESTED BUT WHOSE MEMBERSHIP IN THE EMPLOYEES' PENSION 4 SYSTEM TERMINATED AS A RESULT OF BEING LAID OFF FOR NONDISCIPLINARY 5 REASONS MAY TRANSFER SERVICE CREDIT FOR ELIGIBILITY SERVICE TO THE 6 CORRECTIONAL OFFICERS' RETIREMENT SYSTEM IF THE MEMBER FILES WITH THE 7 BOARD OF TRUSTEES AN EXECUTED WAIVER OF ALL BENEFITS TO WHICH THE 8 MEMBER MAY BE ENTITLED UNDER THE EMPLOYEES' PENSION SYSTEM.

9 (B) ELIGIBILITY SERVICE TRANSFERRED FROM THE EMPLOYEES' PENSION 10 SYSTEM UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION SHALL BE TRANSFERRED AT THE 11 RATE OF 6 MONTHS OF ELIGIBILITY SERVICE IN THE CORRECTIONAL OFFICERS' 12 RETIREMENT SYSTEM FOR EACH YEAR OF ELIGIBILITY SERVICE IN THE EMPLOYEES' 13 PENSION SYSTEM.

15 (a) A member may retire with a normal service retirement allowance if:

16 (1) on or before the date of retirement, the member has at least 20 years 17 of eligibility service;

18 (2) for at least 5 years immediately before retirement, the member was a 19 security attendant at Clifton T. Perkins Hospital Center, a correctional officer in any 20 of the first six job classifications, or in a combination of these positions; and

(3) the member completes and submits a written application to theBoard of Trustees stating the date when the member desires to retire.

(b) On retirement under this section, a member is entitled to receive a normal
service retirement allowance that equals one fifty-fifth of the member's average final
compensation multiplied by the number of years of creditable service.

26 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 27 July 1, 2000.
