- 16 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "COURSE OF CONDUCT" MEANS A PERSISTENT PATTERN
- 17 OF CONDUCT, COMPOSED OF A SERIES OF ACTS OVER A PERIOD OF TIME, THAT
- 18 EVIDENCES A CONTINUITY OF PURPOSE.
- 19 (B) A PERSON MAY NOT ENGAGE IN A COURSE OF CONDUCT WITH THE
- 20 PURPOSE OF VIOLATING ANY OF THE PROVISIONS OF §§ 286 THROUGH 290 OF THIS
- 21 ARTICLE.
- 22 (C) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR
- 23 AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO A TERM OF IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 30
- 24 DAYS OR A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$1,000 OR BOTH.
- 25 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
- 26 effect October 1, 2000.
