Election Law - Deceased Registered Voters

A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the county boards of elections to remove a registered
- 4 voter from the registry upon certain notification that the voter is deceased;
- 5 providing certain procedures for removal; and generally relating to removing
- 6 certain voters from the registry.
- 7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 Article 33 - Election Code

- 16 (a) (1) (i) Information from the agencies specified in this paragraph shall
- 17 be reported to the State Board in a format and at times prescribed by the State Board.
- 18 (ii) The Commissioner of Health of Baltimore City and the health
- 19 officer of each county shall report the names and residence addresses (if known) of all
- 20 individuals at least 16 years of age reported deceased within the city or county since
- 21 the date of the last such report.
- 22 (iii) The clerk of the circuit court for each county and the
- 23 administrative clerk for each District Court shall report the names and addresses of
- 24 all individuals convicted, in the respective court, of theft or infamous crimes since the
- 25 date of the last such report.
- 26 (iv) The clerk of the circuit court for each county shall report the
- 27 former and present names and residence addresses (if known) of all individuals whose

- 1 names have been changed by decree or order of the court since the date of the last 2 report. 3 The State Board shall make arrangements with the clerk of the 4 United States District Court for the District of Maryland to receive reports of names 5 and addresses, if available, of individuals convicted of infamous crimes in that court. 6 The State Board shall transmit to the appropriate local board (b) (1) 7 information gathered pursuant to subsection (a) of this section. 8 Every agency or instrumentality of any county which acquires or 9 condemns or razes or causes to be condemned or razed any building used as a 10 residence within the county shall promptly report such fact and the location of the 11 building to the local board in the county or city. 12 Registration cancellation information provided by an applicant on 13 any voter registration application shall be provided to the appropriate local board by 14 the State Board or another local board. 15 (4) A local board may: 16 Make arrangements to receive change of address information 17 from an entity approved by the State Board; and 18 Pay a reasonable fee to the entity for the information. (ii) WHENEVER A LOCAL BOARD BECOMES AWARE OF AN OBITUARY OR ANY 19 (C) 20 OTHER RELIABLE REPORT OF THE DEATH OF A REGISTERED VOTER, THE ELECTION 21 DIRECTOR SHALL MAIL A NOTICE TO THE REGISTERED VOTER, AS PRESCRIBED BY 22 THE STATE BOARD, TO VERIFY WHETHER THE VOTER IS IN FACT DECEASED.
- 23 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 24 effect June 1, 2000.
