- 4 FOR the purpose of altering the per barrel fee for oil transferred in the State and
- 5 credited to the Maryland Oil Disaster Containment, Clean-Up and Contingency
- Fund; designating a certain per barrel fee to be credited to the Oil Contaminated
- 7 Site Environmental Cleanup Fund and a certain date on which the fee expires;
- 8 designating certain dates that site rehabilitation costs from contamination
- 9 caused by releases from certain oil tanks may be eligible for reimbursement
- from certain funds; designating a certain percentage of revenues in the Oil
- 11 Contaminated Site Environmental Cleanup Fund that shall be used for heating
- oil tank site rehabilitation; increasing the percentage of the Oil Contaminated

16 17	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 21	(a) In this section the following words and phrases have the meanings indicated.
22 23	(1) "Fund" means the Maryland Oil Disaster Containment, Clean-Up and Contingency Fund.
	(2) "Transfer" means the offloading or onloading of oil in the State from or to any commercial vessel, barge, tank truck, tank car, pipeline, or any other means used for transporting oil.
27 28	(3) "Barrel" means any measure of petroleum products or its by-products which consists of 42.0 U.S. gallons of liquid measure.
	(b) A person other than a vessel or barge may not transfer oil in the State without a license.
33	(c) (1) A license required under this section shall be secured from the Department of the Environment subject to the terms and conditions set forth in this section. The fee on any barrel shall be imposed only once, at the point of first transfer in the State. The license fee shall be:
	(i) Based on a [1 cent] 2 CENTS per barrel fee for oil transferred in the State and credited to the Maryland Oil Disaster Containment, Clean-Up and Contingency Fund; and

1 Until July 1, [2000] 2005, based on an additional [0.5 cents] 1 (ii) 2 CENT per barrel fee for oil transferred in the State and credited to the [Maryland Oil 3 Disaster Containment, Clean-Up and Contingency Fund] OIL CONTAMINATED SITE 4 ENVIRONMENTAL CLEANUP FUND AS DESCRIBED IN SUBTITLE 7 OF THIS TITLE. 5 (2) The license fee shall be paid quarterly to the Department and on 6 receipt by the Comptroller, credited to the proper fund. The licensee shall certify to 7 the Department, on forms as may be prescribed by the Department, the number of 8 barrels of oil transferred by the licensee during the fee quarter no later than the last 9 day of the month following the fee quarter. These records shall be kept confidential by 10 the Department. 11 When the balance in the Maryland Oil Disaster Containment, 12 Clean-Up and Contingency Fund from the monthly license fees paid under paragraph 13 (1)(i) of this subsection into the Fund equals or exceeds a maximum limit of 14 \$5,000,000, collection of subsequent monthly license fees under paragraph (1)(i) of 15 this subsection shall be abated until: 16 The balance in the Fund from the license fees becomes less than (i) 17 or equal to \$4,000,000; or 18 There is evidence that the balance in the Fund could be 19 significantly reduced by the recent occurrence of a major discharge or series of 20 discharges. 21 (4) If a licensee fails to remit the fee and accompanying certification 22 required by this section, the amount of the license fee due shall be determined by the 23 Department from information as may be available. Notice of this determination shall 24 be given to the licensee liable for payment of the license fee. The determination shall 25 finally and irrevocably fix the fee unless the licensee against whom it is assessed, 26 within 30 days after receiving notice of the determination, shall apply to the 27 Department for a hearing or unless the Department, on its own, shall redetermine the 28 fee. 29 The Department shall promulgate rules and regulations, establish 30 audit procedures for the audit of licensees, and prescribe and publish forms as may be 31 necessary to effectuate the purposes of this section. 32 As a condition precedent to the issuance or renewal of a license, the (d) 33 Department shall require satisfactory evidence that the applicant has implemented 34 or is in the process of implementing State and federal plans and regulations to control pollution related to oil, petroleum products, and their by-products and the abatement 36 thereof when a discharge occurs. 37 Any person who violates subsection (b) or subsection (c) of this section is 38 guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction in a court of competent jurisdiction is subject to a fine not exceeding \$10,000 plus any accrued but unpaid license fees. 40 There is a Maryland Oil Disaster Containment, Clean-Up and


41 Contingency Fund for the Department to use to develop equipment, personnel, and

- 1 plans; for contingency actions to respond to, contain, clean-up, and remove from the
- 2 land and waters of the State discharges of oil, petroleum products, and their
- 3 by-products into, upon, or adjacent to the waters of the State; and restore natural
- 4 resources damaged by discharges. The cost of containment, clean-up, removal, and
- 5 restoration, including attorneys' fees and litigation costs, shall be reimbursed to the
- 6 State by the person responsible for the discharge. The reimbursement shall be
- 7 credited to the Fund. The Fund shall be limited in accordance with the limits set forth
- 8 in this section. To this sum shall be credited every license fee, fine, if imposed by the
- 9 circuit court for any county, and any other charge related to this subtitle. To this Fund
- 10 shall be charged every expense the Department of the Environment has which relates
- 11 to this section.
- 12 (g) Money in the Fund not needed currently to meet the Department of the
- 13 Environment's obligations in the exercise of its responsibility under this section shall
- 14 be deposited with the State Treasurer to the credit of the Fund, and may be invested
- 15 as provided by law. Interest received on the investment shall be credited to the Fund.
- 16 The Secretary of the Environment shall determine the proper allocation of the
- 17 moneys credited to the Fund only for the following purposes:
- 18 (1) Administrative expenses, personnel expenses, and equipment costs of
- 19 the Department related to the purposes of this section.
- 20 Prevention, control, containment, clean-up, and removal of
- 21 discharges into, upon, or adjacent to waters of the State of discharges of oil, petroleum
- 22 products and their by-products, and the restoration of natural resources damaged by
- 23 such discharges.
- 24 (3) Development of containment and clean-up equipment, plans, and
- 25 procedures in accordance with the purposes of this section.
- 26 (4) Paying insurance costs by the State to extend or implement the
- 27 benefits of the Fund.
- 28 (h) The Department shall provide the standing committees of the Maryland
- 29 General Assembly with primary jurisdiction over this section with a status report on
- 30 the Fund on or before October 1 of each year. The report shall include an accounting
- 31 of all moneys expended for each of the purposes specified in subsection (g) of this
- 32 section.

- 5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That beginning in fiscal year
- 6 2001, notwithstanding the provisions of § 4-607(d)(3) of the Environment Article, the
- 7 Secretary of the Environment shall be authorized to use \$300,000 per fiscal year, for
- 8 fiscal year 2001, fiscal year 2002, fiscal year 2003, fiscal year 2004, and fiscal year

- 18 Environment shall convene a work group consisting of representatives of the various
- 19 sectors of the petroleum marketing industry and representatives from appropriate
- 20 public and private entities to review and assess long-term funding needs of the oil
- 21 pollution programs in the State. Subject to § 2-1246 of the State Government Article,
- 22 the Department of the Environment shall report the findings and recommendations
- 23 of the work group to the Legislative Policy Committee, the House Environmental
- 24 Matters Committee, and the Senate Economic and Environmental Affairs Committee
- 25 on a date to be determined by the Secretary, but no later than November 1, 2004.
- 26 SECTION 4: <u>5.</u> AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 27 effect July 1, 2000.
