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1 (IV) CURRICULUM AND ACTIVITIES THAT ARE COORDINATED WITH 2 AN AFTER SCHOOL OPPORTUNITY PROGRAM OPERATING UNDER ARTICLE 41, TITLE 6, 3 SUBTITLE 8 OF THE CODE; 4 (V) TUTORING IN SUBJECTS SPECIFIED IN THE PROPOSAL; OR 5 (VI) FIELD TRIPS TO LOCATIONS DESCRIBED IN THE PROPOSAL. A COUNTY BOARD SHALL INCLUDE IN A PROPOSAL THE ESTIMATED (2) 6 7 COST OF EXTENDING THE CONTRACTS OF PARTICIPATING TEACHERS. (E) FOR FISCAL YEAR 2002 AND EACH SUCCEEDING FISCAL YEAR, THE 8 (1) 9 GOVERNOR SHALL INCLUDE \$10 MILLION IN THE STATE BUDGET TO ACCOMPLISH 10 THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION.
