- 3 FOR the purpose of making it discretionary, rather than mandatory, for the Chief
- Judge of the District Court to appoint constables in each district; making it 4

- repealing a requirement that every court or division of a court in a district have 7

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 15
- 16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- The Chief Judge of the District Court, upon the recommendation of the 19
- 20 administrative judge of each district, [shall] MAY appoint the number of constables
- 21 required to serve process of the District Court within that district. [The] AN
- 22 administrative judge [shall] MAY assign the constables to the various courts or
- 23 divisions of courts within [his] A district [so that every court or division of a court
- 24 has at least one constable] AS THE ADMINISTRATIVE JUDGE CONSIDERS NECESSARY.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 25
- 26 June 1, 2000.
