A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Vehicle Laws - Issuance of Temporary "Maryland Only" Driver's License**

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Motor Vehicle Administration, under certain
4 circumstances, to issue a temporary "Maryland Only" license to an applicant for
5 reinstatement of a suspended or revoked driver's license or an applicant for
6 renewal of a driver's license, if the applicant's privilege to drive in another
7 jurisdiction was revoked or suspended at the time of application as a result of
8 failing to comply with the licensing requirements of that jurisdiction; providing
9 that a temporary license issued under this Act is valid for a certain period; and
10 generally relating to issuance of temporary drivers' licenses.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 **Article - Transportation**

20 (e) (1) In addition to the other restrictions provided under this subtitle, the
21 Administration may issue:

22 (I) [a] A driver's license that is valid only in the State of Maryland
23 to an applicant who has been suspended in another jurisdiction as a result of failing
24 to comply with the financial responsibility requirements of that jurisdiction[.]; OR

25 (II) A TEMPORARY DRIVER'S LICENSE THAT IS VALID ONLY IN THE
26 STATE OF MARYLAND TO AN APPLICANT FOR REINSTATEMENT OF A SUSPENDED OR
27 REVOKED DRIVER'S LICENSE OR FOR RENEWAL OF A DRIVER'S LICENSE IF, AT THE
28 TIME OF APPLICATION:

1 1. THE APPLICANT'S PRIVILEGE TO DRIVE IN ANOTHER
2 JURISDICTION IS REVOKED OR SUSPENDED AS A RESULT OF FAILING TO COMPLY
3 WITH THE LICENSING REQUIREMENTS OF THAT JURISDICTION FOR WHICH A
4 COMPARABLE VIOLATION IN THIS STATE WOULD NOT HAVE RESULTED IN
5 REVOCATION OR SUSPENSION;

6 2. THE APPLICANT IS OTHERWISE QUALIFIED TO BE
7 LICENSED IN THIS STATE; AND

8 3. THE ADMINISTRATION DETERMINES THAT THE
9 APPLICANT WILL BE ABLE TO TAKE ANY ACTIONS REQUIRED BY THE OTHER
10 JURISDICTION FOR REINSTATEMENT OF THE PRIVILEGE TO DRIVE IN THAT
11 JURISDICTION.

12 (2) A TEMPORARY LICENSE ISSUED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS
13 SUBSECTION SHALL BE VALID FOR 90 DAYS.

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
15 October 1, 2000.
