11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

Chapter 226 of the Acts of 1999

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 15 MARYLAND, That:

16 (e) The Task Force shall:

17 (1) examine the concerns of, and problems encountered by, individuals 18 with a food allergy who eat in restaurants;

19(2)consult with the federal Food and Drug Administration on food20labeling laws and policies;

1 (3) recommend measures to address the problems and concerns 2 identified by the Task Force; and

3 (4) report its recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with 4 § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly by December 1, 5 [2000] 2001.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
7 October 1, 1999. It shall remain effective for a period of [1 year and 7] 2 YEARS AND
8 7 months and, at the end of April 30, [2001] 2002, and with no further action required
9 by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and
10 effect.

11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 12 October 1, 2000.
