- 5 (e) <u>In appointing members of the Commission, the Governor shall ensure</u>

- 7 (f) The Department of Education shall provide staff support for the
- 8 Commission.
- 9 (g) On or before January 1, 2001, the Commission shall provide an
- 10 interim report to the Governor and, subject to § 2-1246 of the State Government
- 11 Article, the General Assembly.
- 12 <u>On or before November 1, 2001, the Commission shall provide a final</u>
- 13 report containing the findings and recommendations of the Commission to the
- 14 Governor and, subject to § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, the General
- 15 Assembly.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 17 October June 1, 2000. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 7 months
- 18 and, at the end of December 31, 2001, with no further action required by the General
- 19 Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
