17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Courts and Judicial Proceedings

(a) In each county in the first seven judicial circuits there shall be the number of resident judges of the circuit court set forth below, including the judge or judges provided for by the Constitution:

- (2) Anne Arundel[10] 11
- (3) Baltimore County.....[16] 17
- (15) Montgomery[17] 18
- (16) Prince George's.....[23] 24
- (23) Worcester [2] 3

(b) In Baltimore City there shall be [30] 31 resident judges of the Circuit Court for Baltimore City.

~~For the purposes of operation and administration of the District Court, the State is divided into the following districts:~~

11 (8) District 8—13

12 (9) District 9—4

13 (10) District 10—7, two to be appointed from Carroll County and five to
14 be appointed from Howard County

15 (11) District 11—5, three to be appointed from Frederick County and two
16 to be appointed from Washington County

17 (12) District 12—3, two to be appointed from Allegany County

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
19 July 1, 2000.
