- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring a person convicted of certain child abduction offenses to
- 4 make restitution in addition to other penalties; requiring the restitution under

- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 Article - Family Law

- 21 If a child is under the age of 16 years, a relative who knows that another person
- 22 is the lawful custodian of the child may not:
- 23 (1) abduct, take, or carry away the child from the lawful custodian to a
- 24 place within this State;
- 25 (2) having acquired lawful possession of the child, detain the child
- 26 within this State for more than 48 hours after the lawful custodian demands that the
- 27 child be returned;

- 1 (3) harbor or hide the child within this State, knowing that possession of 2 the child was obtained by another relative in violation of this section; or 3 (4) act as an accessory to an act prohibited by this section.

- If a child is under the age of 16 years, a relative who knows that another person 6 is the lawful custodian of the child may not:
- 7 (1) abduct, take, or carry away the child from the lawful custodian to a 8 place outside of this State;
- 9 (2) having acquired lawful possession of the child, detain the child 10 outside of this State for more than 48 hours after the lawful custodian demands that 11 the child be returned:
- 12 (3) harbor or hide the child outside of this State knowing that possession 13 of the child was obtained by another relative in violation of this section; or
- 14 (4) act as an accessory to an act prohibited by this section.

- 16 (a) A person who violates any provision of § 9-304 of this subtitle is guilty of a 17 misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding \$250 or
- 18 imprisonment not exceeding 30 days.
- 19 (b) If the child is out of the custody of the lawful custodian for not more than
- 20 30 days, a person who violates any provision of § 9-305 of this subtitle is guilty of a
- 21 felony and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding \$250 or imprisonment not
- 22 exceeding 30 days, or both.
- 23 (c) If the child is out of the custody of the lawful custodian for more than 30
- 24 days, a person who violates any provision of § 9-305 of this subtitle is guilty of a
- 25 felony and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding \$1,000 or imprisonment not
- 26 exceeding 1 year, or both.
- 27 (D) IN ADDITION TO THE OTHER PENALTIES IN THIS SECTION, UPON
- 28 CONVICTION OF A VIOLATION OF § 9-304 OR § 9-305 OF THIS SUBTITLE, A PERSON
- 29 SHALL MAKE RESTITUTION THAT INCLUDES REPAYMENT OF COSTS INCURRED BY
- 30 THE STATE IN LOCATING AND RETURNING A CHILD AS A RESULT OF THE CONDUCT
- 31 OF THE PERSON THAT GAVE RISE TO THE CONVICTION.
- 32 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 33 October 1, 2000.
