- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 Article - Labor and Employment

- 17 9-742.
- 18 (a) The Commission retains jurisdiction pending an appeal to consider:
- 19 (1) a request for additional medical treatment and attention; AND
- 20 (2) A REQUEST FOR TEMPORARY TOTAL BENEFITS.
- 21 (b) (1) If the Commission finds that a covered employee needs additional
- 22 medical attention pending an appeal, the Commission may pass a supplemental order
- 23 requiring the employer to provide additional medical treatment and attention.
- 24 (2) IF THE COMMISSION FINDS THAT A COVERED EMPLOYEE NEEDS
- 25 TEMPORARY TOTAL BENEFITS PENDING AN APPEAL, THE COMMISSION MAY PASS A
- 26 SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER REQUIRING THE EMPLOYER TO PROVIDE THE EMPLOYEE
- 27 WITH TEMPORARY TOTAL BENEFITS.

- A supplemental order passed by the Commission under this section is 1 (c) 2 subject to review on the pending appeal.
- 3 (d) When an appeal that is pending relates solely to a penalty imposed by the 4 Commission, the Commission retains jurisdiction over all matters in the case other
- 5 than imposition of the penalty.
- 6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 7 October 1, 2000.
