- 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 22 (C) A PERSON MAY NOT SELL OR DISTRIBUTE, OR ATTEMPT TO SELL OR
- 23 DISTRIBUTE, GOODS OR MATERIALS TO THE OCCUPANT OF A VEHICLE ON A
- 24 HIGHWAY WITHIN 50 YARDS OF A TRAFFIC CONTROL SIGNAL.

- 26 (a) It is a misdemeanor for any person to violate any of the provisions of the
- 27 Maryland Vehicle Law unless the violation:

- 1 (1) Is declared to be a felony by the Maryland Vehicle Law or by any 2 other law of this State; or
- $3 \hspace{1cm} (2) \hspace{1cm}$ Is punishable by a civil penalty under the applicable provision of the 4 Maryland Vehicle Law.
- 5 (b) Except as otherwise provided in this section, any person convicted of a 6 misdemeanor for the violation of any of the provisions of the Maryland Vehicle Law is 7 subject to a fine of not more than \$500.
- 8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 9 October 1, 2000.
