3 FOR the purpose of altering the dates of certain elections for municipal offices in Baltimore City; and generally relating to elections in Baltimore City. 4

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 10

11 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

12 13 8-201. There shall be a statewide primary election in every even-numbered 14 (a) (1) 15 year. 16 (2)

A primary election shall be held:

In the year in which the Governor is elected, on the second 17 (i) 18 Tuesday after the first Monday in September; and

19 In the year in which the President of the United States is (ii) 20 elected, on the first Tuesday in March.

2 primary election for municipal offices on the second Tuesday following the first

3 Monday in September in the year [following the election of the Governor] THAT THE

6 (a) (1) There shall be a statewide general election in each even-numbered 7 year.

8 (2) A statewide general election shall be held on the Tuesday following 9 the first Monday in November.

10 (b) [In] BEGINNING IN THE YEAR 2004, IN Baltimore City, there shall be a

11 general election for municipal offices on the [Tuesday following the first Monday in

12 November in the year following the election of the Governor] SAME DAY AS THE

13 GENERAL ELECTION FOR PRESIDENT AND VICE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES.

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 15 October 1, 2000.
