A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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Nursing Homes - Required Staffing

3 FOR the purpose of requiring nursing homes to meet certain staffing requirements to

- 4 qualify for licensure; requiring nursing homes to employ certain individuals for
- 5 certain positions; specifying certain duties that certain individuals may not
- 6 perform; specifying certain staffing levels for nursing homes; requiring nursing
- 7 homes to post certain information in certain areas of the home on a certain form
- 8 developed by the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene; providing for
- 9 certification of staffing levels; authorizing the Department to improve working
- 10 conditions and salary levels; providing for certain penalties; authorizing the
- 11 Department to adopt certain regulations; and generally relating to staffing
- 12 requirements for nursing homes.

13 BY adding to

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

- 19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Health - General

21 19-1410.

22 (A) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS 23 INDICATED.

24	(1)	"LICENSED PERSONNEL" MEANS:	
25 26 S	STATE; OR	(I)	A REGISTERED NURSE WHO IS LICENSED TO PRACTICE IN THE
27 28 S	STATE.	(II)	A PRACTICAL NURSE WHO IS LICENSED TO PRACTICE IN THE

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(2) "UNLICENSED PERSONNEL" MEANS A CERTIFIED NURSE ASSISTANT,
 NURSE AIDE, CERTIFIED MEDICATION AIDE, OR OTHER NURSING HOME EMPLOYEE
 REQUIRED TO PROVIDE DIRECT NURSING CARE TO NURSING HOME RESIDENTS.

4 (B) A NURSING HOME SHALL EMPLOY STAFF SUFFICIENT IN NUMBER AND 5 QUALIFICATIONS TO MEET THE SCHEDULED AND UNSCHEDULED NURSING CARE 6 NEEDS OF THE RESIDENTS.

7 (C) TO QUALIFY FOR A LICENSE OR RENEWAL LICENSE:

8 (1) A NURSING HOME SHALL PROVIDE SUFFICIENT STAFF TO ENSURE 9 AT LEAST A TOTAL OF 4 HOURS OF DIRECT NURSING CARE PER RESIDENT PER DAY;

10 (2) OF THE TOTAL DIRECT NURSING CARE HOURS PER PATIENT PER 11 DAY, AT LEAST 3 HOURS OF THAT CARE SHALL BE PROVIDED BY UNLICENSED 12 PERSONNEL AND AT LEAST 1 HOUR OF THAT CARE SHALL BE PROVIDED BY 13 LICENSED PERSONNEL;

14 (3) LICENSED PERSONNEL AND UNLICENSED PERSONNEL MAY NOT
15 PROVIDE FOOD PREPARATION, HOUSEKEEPING, LAUNDRY, OR MAINTENANCE
16 SERVICES; AND

17 (4) AN INDIVIDUAL EMPLOYED TO PROVIDE FOOD PREPARATION,
18 HOUSEKEEPING, LAUNDRY, OR MAINTENANCE SERVICES MAY NOT PROVIDE
19 NURSING CARE TO RESIDENTS.

20 (D) (1) A NURSING HOME SHALL DISPLAY ON EACH FLOOR OF THE HOME A 21 NOTICE THAT EXPLAINS THE CURRENT RATIO OF LICENSED PERSONNEL TO 22 RESIDENTS AND UNLICENSED PERSONNEL TO RESIDENTS.

23 (2) THE NOTICE SHALL BE:

(I) POSTED IN A LOCATION THAT IS VISIBLE AND ACCESSIBLE TO
 25 RESIDENTS, FAMILY MEMBERS OF THE RESIDENTS, CAREGIVERS, AND POTENTIAL
 26 CONSUMERS; AND

27 (II) ON A FORM PROVIDED BY THE DEPARTMENT.

28 (E) (1) THE STAFFING REQUIREMENTS UNDER THIS SECTION ARE
29 MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS AND MAY NOT BE CONSTRUED TO LIMIT THE ABILITY OF
30 THE NURSING HOME TO EMPLOY ADDITIONAL STAFF.

(2) FOR A NURSING HOME OR GROUP OF NURSING HOMES, THE
 DEPARTMENT MAY INCREASE THE MINIMUM STAFF RATIO TO ADDRESS RESIDENT
 ACUITY LEVELS.

34 (3) THE SECRETARY SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS FOR THE
35 IMPLEMENTATION OF STAFFING REQUIREMENTS ABOVE THE MINIMUM LEVELS
36 REQUIRED BY THIS SECTION.

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(F) FOR ANY NURSING HOME WITH A CURRENT MARYLAND LICENSE ON
 OCTOBER 1, 2000, THE NURSING HOME MUST PROVIDE CERTIFICATION TO THE
 DEPARTMENT THAT THE MINIMUM STAFFING REQUIREMENTS WILL BE MET AS OF
 APRIL 1, 2002.

G) FOR ANY NURSING HOME APPLYING FOR A NEW MARYLAND LICENSE ON
OR AFTER OCTOBER 1, 2000, THE NURSING HOME SHALL PROVIDE CERTIFICATION TO
THE DEPARTMENT THAT THE MINIMUM STAFFING REQUIREMENTS WILL BE MET NO
LATER THAN JANUARY 1, 2001.

10 (A) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS 11 INDICATED.

12 (1) "LICENSED PERSONNEL" MEANS:

13(I)A REGISTERED NURSE WHO IS LICENSED TO PRACTICE IN THE14 STATE; OR

15(II)A PRACTICAL NURSE WHO IS LICENSED TO PRACTICE IN THE16 STATE.

17 (2) "UNLICENSED PERSONNEL" MEANS A CERTIFIED NURSE ASSISTANT,
18 NURSE AIDE, CERTIFIED MEDICATION AIDE, OR OTHER NURSING HOME EMPLOYEE
19 REQUIRED TO PROVIDE DIRECT NURSING CARE TO NURSING HOME RESIDENTS.

(B) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL TAKE AFFIRMATIVE ACTION TO IMPROVE
WORKING CONDITIONS AND INCREASE RETENTION OF NURSING HOME DIRECT CARE
PERSONNEL. THIS ACTION SHALL INCLUDE, BUT NOT BE LIMITED TO, MODIFICATION
OF THE DEPARTMENT'S MEDICAID REIMBURSEMENT METHODOLOGY TO PROVIDE
ADDITIONAL MEDICAID FUNDS FOR:

25 (1) REIMBURSEMENT OF NURSING HOME STAFFING COSTS THAT ARE
26 INCURRED UNDER § 19-1410 OF THIS SUBTITLE;

27 (2) THE REIMBURSEMENT OF TRAINING EXPENSES FOR LICENSED28 PERSONNEL AND UNLICENSED PERSONNEL; AND

29 (3) DIRECT REIMBURSEMENT TO NURSING HOMES TO INCREASE THE
 30 HOURLY WAGE OF CERTIFIED NURSING ASSISTANTS TO A MINIMUM OF \$2 PER HOUR.

31 (C) THE SECRETARY MAY ADOPT THE REGULATIONS NECESSARY TO CARRY 32 OUT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION.

IF A NURSING HOME FAILS TO MEET THE REQUIREMENTS OF § 19-1410 OF THIS
 SUBTITLE, THE SECRETARY MAY IMPOSE ONE OR MORE OF THE FOLLOWING
 PENALTIES:

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1(1)REQUIRE A NURSING HOME TO PROVIDE AN ACCEPTABLE PLAN OF2CORRECTION OR SHOW CAUSE TO THE SATISFACTION OF THE DEPARTMENT WHY IT3IS IMPOSSIBLE FOR THE NURSING HOME TO MEET THE REQUIREMENTS;

- 4 (2) SUSPENSION OF THE NURSING HOME LICENSE;
- 5 (3) REVOCATION OF THE NURSING HOME LICENSE;
- 6 (4) \$500 PER DAY FOR EACH DAY A VIOLATION CONTINUES; OR
- 7 (5) DECERTIFICATION.

8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect

9 October 1, 2000.

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
