

1 (iii) In the town of Kensington, the Montgomery County Board of
 2 License Commissioners may issue a special 2-day on-sale beer, wine, and liquor
 3 license to any bona fide religious, fraternal, civic, or charitable organization holding
 4 an event on municipal property located at 3710 Mitchell Street, Kensington,
 5 Maryland.

6 (IV) 1. IN THE TOWN OF KENSINGTON, THE MONTGOMERY
 7 COUNTY BOARD OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS MAY ISSUE A SPECIAL B-K BEER, WINE
 8 AND LIQUOR LICENSE FOR USE ON THE PREMISES OF A RESTAURANT LOCATED IN
 9 THE FOLLOWING COMMERCIAL AREAS:

10 A. THE WEST SIDE OF CONNECTICUT AVENUE BETWEEN
 11 KNOWLES AVENUE AND PERRY AVENUE;

12 B. THE EAST SIDE OF CONNECTICUT AVENUE BETWEEN
 13 KNOWLES AVENUE AND DUPONT STREET AND BETWEEN UNIVERSITY BOULEVARD
 14 AND PERRY AVENUE;

15 C. THE WEST SIDE OF UNIVERSITY BOULEVARD WEST;

16 D. DUPONT AVENUE, WEST OF CONNECTICUT AVENUE;

17 E. PLYERS MILL ROAD, WEST OF METROPOLITAN AVENUE;

18 F. SUMMIT AVENUE BETWEEN KNOWLES AVENUE AND
 19 HOWARD AVENUE;

20 G. DETRICK AVENUE BETWEEN KNOWLES AVENUE AND
 21 HOWARD AVENUE; OR

22 H. THE SOUTHWEST SIDE OF METROPOLITAN AVENUE
 23 BETWEEN NORTH KENSINGTON PARKWAY AND PLYERS MILL ROAD.

24 2. A SPECIAL B-K BEER, WINE AND LIQUOR LICENSE
 25 AUTHORIZES THE HOLDER TO KEEP FOR SALE AND SELL ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES
 26 FOR CONSUMPTION ON THE PREMISES ONLY.

27 3. A LICENSEE SHALL MAINTAIN AVERAGE DAILY RECEIPTS
 28 FROM THE SALE OF FOOD, NOT INCLUDING CARRYOUT FOOD, OF AT LEAST 70% OF
 29 THE OVERALL AVERAGE DAILY RECEIPTS.

30 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That before this Act becomes
 31 legally effective it shall first be submitted to a referendum of the legally qualified
 32 voters of the town of Kensington at a special election in 2000, to be determined by the
 33 Kensington Town Council and Mayor. The Kensington Town Council and the Mayor of
 34 Kensington shall do those things necessary and proper to provide for and hold the
 35 referendum required by this section. If a majority of the votes cast on the question are
 36 "For the referred law" the provisions of this Act shall become effective on the 30th day
 37 following the official canvass of votes for the referendum, but if a majority of the votes

1 cast on the question are "Against the referred law" the provisions of this Act are of no
2 effect and null and void.

3 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, subject to the provisions
4 of Section 2 of this Act and for the sole purpose of providing for the referendum
5 required by Section 2 of this Act, this Act shall take effect June 1, 2000.
