- 1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That before this Act becomes
- 2 legally effective it shall first be submitted to a referendum of the legally qualified
- 3 voters of the town of Kensington at a special election in 2000, to be determined by the
- 4 Kensington Town Council and Mayor. The Kensington Town Council and the Mayor of
- 5 Kensington shall do those things necessary and proper to provide for and hold the
- 6 referendum required by this section. If a majority of the votes cast on the question are
- 7 "For the referred law" the provisions of this Act shall become effective on the 30th day
- 8 following the official canvass of votes for the referendum, but if a majority of the votes
- 9 cast on the question are "Against the referred law" the provisions of this Act are of no
- 10 effect and null and void.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, subject to the provisions
- 12 of Section 2 of this Act and for the sole purpose of providing for the referendum
- 13 required by Section 2 of this Act, this Act shall take effect June 1, 2000.
