2 Angler's Licenses - Nontidal Waters - Nonresident License Fees							
FOR the purpose of modifying the fees for certain nonresident fishing licenses to provide that the fee shall be either a specified amount or the fee charged to a Maryland resident for a similar license by the nonresident's home state, whichever is greater; limiting how certain revenues may be used; requiring the Department of Natural Resources to report annually in a certain manner on certain information; and generally relating to certain nonresident fishing licenses.

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

19 (a) This section provides a fund to pay the expense of protecting and managing 20 game and freshwater fish and preventing unauthorized persons from fishing or 21 attempting to fish for any game and freshwater fish without first procuring an 22 angler's license.							

- 1 (b) (1) In this section, "resident" means a person who resides in this State on 2 the date he applies for a license.
- 3 (2) "Resident" includes a member of the armed forces of the United 4 States who is on active duty and stationed officially in this State.
- 5 (c) Any person 16 years old or older shall secure an angler's license to fish in 6 the nontidal waters of the State. An angler's license entitles the holder to fish in the 7 nontidal waters of the State only during the open season.
- 8 (d) An angler's license is not required of the following:
- 9 (1) The owner or tenant of land bordering on nontidal water, his spouse 10 and children, or the spouse of any child who resides on the land with the owner or 11 tenant when he fishes in nontidal water adjoining his land;
- 12 (2) Any convalescent patient of a veterans' hospital hospitalized for a 13 service connected disability who fishes in nontidal waters if the patient secures a 14 permit issued by a special service officer of the American Red Cross under authority 15 granted by the Department;
- 16 (3) Any group of disabled or convalescent patients organized and under 17 the care and supervision of the American Red Cross, which upon the request of the 18 American Red Cross, is authorized by the Department to fish for any recreational 19 purpose in the nontidal waters;
- 20 (4) Any resident serving in the armed forces of the United States, while 21 on leave in the State, during his leave period, if, while angling, he possesses a copy of 22 his official leave orders;
- 23 (5) Any patient who is under treatment by a State-approved mental 24 health facility, and any individual who attends or resides in a State-approved 25 retardation facility, provided the administrator of the facility certifies that the patient 26 or individual is engaged in an approved therapeutic program which would involve a 27 fishing activity;
- 28 (6) A person who fishes in nontidal waters of the State on free fishing 29 days designated by the Secretary; or
- 30 (7) A person holding a current resident consolidated senior sport fishing 31 license issued under § 4-216 of this title.
- 32 (e) A person may apply for an angler's license to any person designated by the 33 Department. The application shall be on a form the Department prepares and 34 supplies. The applicant shall fill out, sign and submit the application to the person 35 designated to issue an angler's license. A person may apply by mail.
- 36 (f) (1) The application shall contain the applicant's name, age, height, and 37 place of residence.

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- 1 (3) (I) ALL FEES COLLECTED BY THE DEPARTMENT UNDER THIS 2 SECTION MAY ONLY BE USED IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 4-208 OF THIS TITLE.
- 3 (II) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PUBLICLY REPORT ANNUALLY THE 4 AMOUNTS COLLECTED AND THE EXPENDITURES UNDER THIS SECTION.
- 5 (h) A person designated to sell an angler's license shall issue the license and
- 6 collect the fee prescribed in subsection (g) of this section. The Department shall
- 7 furnish the licenses to the designated persons. An angler's license shall bear the
- 8 Secretary's facsimile signature and the counter-signature of the issuing person. The
- 9 person who issues the license shall fill out the name and address of the licensee on a
- 10 stub attached to the license blank and detach the stub. The stubs and money, collected
- 11 every month, shall be mailed to the Department on the first day of the succeeding
- 12 month. As compensation, the agent shall retain 50 cents for each license issued.
- 13 (i) Every angler's license shall expire on December 31 of each year following 14 the date of issuance.
- 15 (j) The licensee shall sign his name in ink on the license at the time of
- 16 purchase. The license may not be transferred to another person, nor used or
- 17 presented by any person other than the person to whom it was issued.
- 18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 19 October 1, 2000.
