14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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18 (a) The Department shall:

19 (1) Duplicate information contained on all chemical information lists and 20 material safety data sheets that the Department receives under § 5-406 of the Labor 21 and Employment Article;

22 (2) Maintain this information in a central repository for a period of 40 23 years; and

24 (3) Provide access to this information by the persons who are allowed 25 access under this subtitle.

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1 (b) On written request to the Department, the following persons may have 2 access to, inspect, and make a copy, at the person's expense, of any chemical 3 information list and material safety data sheet that contains information on 4 hazardous or toxic chemicals and that the Department maintains under this subtitle: 5 Any environmental organization that is in the State of Maryland; (1)6 Any civic or consumer organization that is in the State of Maryland; (2)7 and 8 (3) Any individual who lives: 9 (i) In a local community where a business stores, produces, or 10 locates hazardous or toxic chemicals; or 11 (ii) In the nearest local community to a business that stores, 12 produces, or locates hazardous or toxic chemicals. 13 Whenever the Department receives a written request, under this subtitle, (c) 14 for chemical information lists and material safety data sheets submitted by an 15 employer in accordance with § 5-406 of the Labor and Employment Article, the 16 Department shall promptly notify the employer of the request. 17 THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PREPARE BROCHURES AND OTHER WRITTEN (D) 18 MATERIALS FOR THE GENERAL PUBLIC ADDRESSING EXPOSURE TO LEAD PAINT AND 19 OTHER HAZARDOUS OR TOXIC CHEMICALS, INCLUDING DESCRIPTIONS OF: COMMONLY USED PRODUCTS THAT CONTAIN HAZARDOUS OR TOXIC 20 (1)21 CHEMICALS, AS DEFINED IN § 6-501 OF THIS SUBTITLE; 22 (2)LOCATIONS WHERE THE PRODUCTS MAY BE PRESENT; 23 ALTERNATE PRODUCTS THAT MAY BE USED FOR THE SAME (3)24 PURPOSES: MEASURES TO LIMIT EXPOSURE TO HAZARDOUS OR TOXIC 25 (4) 26 CHEMICALS; AND 27 STEPS TO TAKE WHEN EXPOSED TO THE CHEMICALS.
