SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

- 22 (1) NOTIFY EACH PROSPECTIVE RESIDENT AND EACH PROSPECTIVE

- 24 THAT THE RESIDENT OR EMPLOYEE AGREE TO BE IMMUNIZED AGAINST INFLUENZA
