CHAPTER
1 AN ACT concerning
2 Baltimore City - Orphans' Court Judges - Pensions
FOR the purpose of altering the calculation of the pensions for the associate judges and the Chief Judge of the Orphans' Court for Baltimore City; altering the maximum pensions that may be paid; providing for the construction of this Act; and generally relating to pensions for the associate judges and the Chief Judge of the Orphans' Court for Baltimore City.
8 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, 9 Article - Estates and Trusts 10 Section 2-108(d) 11 Annotated Code of Maryland 12 (1991 Replacement Volume and 1999 Supplement)
13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
15 Article - Estates and Trusts
16 2-108.
17 (d) (1) (i) Each associate judge of the Court of Baltimore City shall receive 18 an annual compensation of \$50,000, and the Chief Judge shall receive an annual 19 compensation of \$60,000.
20 (ii) Each associate judge who was in active service on or after 21 January 1, 1981 shall be paid after the termination of active service, if he is then at 22 least 60 years of age or when he shall attain 60 years of age, a pension or salary

- 1 calculated at the rate of \$1,500 annually for each year, or a part of a year, of active
- 2 service ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 31, 1984 AND \$2,500 ANNUALLY FOR EACH YEAR, OR
- 3 PART OF A YEAR, OF ACTIVE SERVICE ON OR AFTER JANUARY 1, 1984; but the
- 4 maximum pension or salary for the service by an associate judge may not exceed
- 5 [\$15,000] \$25,000 annually.
- 6 (III) Each Chief Judge who was in active service on or after January
- 7 1, 1981, shall be paid, after the termination of active service, if he is then at least 60
- 8 years of age or when he shall attain 60 years of age, a pension or salary calculated at
- 9 the rate of \$1.525 annually for each year, or a part of a year of active service[.] ON OR
- 10 BEFORE DECEMBER 31, 1984 AND \$3,000 ANNUALLY FOR EACH YEAR, OR PART OF A
- 11 YEAR, OF ACTIVE SERVICE ON OR AFTER JANUARY 1, 1984; but the maximum pension
- 12 or salary for the service by a Chief Judge may not exceed [\$15,250] \$ 30,000 annually.
- 13 The pension or salary shall be paid by the City of Baltimore in the same manner as
- 14 the salaries of the judges of the Court for the City are paid.
- 15 (2) The surviving spouse of every elected judge of the Court of Baltimore
- 16 City shall be paid one half of the pension to which his spouse was entitled at the time
- 17 of his death, or would have become entitled to by reason of attaining 60 years of age.
- 18 In each instance, the pension shall be paid to the spouse until remarriage or death.
- 19 The provisions of this subsection shall not apply in the case of a spouse who was
- 20 married to a sitting judge for a period of less than three years prior to his death, and
- 21 to a retired judge for a period less than three years before his retirement.
- 22 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be
- 23 construed only prospectively and may not be applied or interpreted to have any effect
- 24 on or application to any pension payable to an associate judge or the Chief Judge of
- 25 the Orphans' Court of Baltimore City before the effective date of this Act.
- 26 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 27 July 1, 2000.
