13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article - Education

17 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "DISCRIMINATION" INCLUDES CONDONING, FAILING TO
18 ENFORCE RULES AGAINST, OR FOSTERING AN ATMOSPHERE THAT MAY LEAD TO,
19 THE VERBAL OR PHYSICAL ABUSE OF A PERSON.

(B) A PUBLIC SCHOOL OR A SCHOOL THAT RECEIVES, OR BENEFITS FROM,
STATE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE MAY NOT DISCRIMINATE AGAINST A PERSON BASED
ON THE REAL OR PERCEIVED GENDER, RACE, CREED, AGE, COLOR, NATIONAL ORIGIN,
MARITAL STATUS, RELIGION, SEXUAL ORIENTATION, OR, IF THE PERSON CAN
PERFORM THE ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS OF THE CURRICULUM WITH REASONABLE
ACCOMMODATION FROM THE SCHOOL AND WITHOUT UNDUE HARDSHIP ON THE
SCHOOL, MENTAL OR PHYSICAL DISABILITY OF THE PERSON.
