

1 (3) Presents a birth certificate or other proof of age and identity
2 acceptable to the Administration; and

3 (4) Presents a completed application for an identification card on a form
4 furnished by the Administration.

5 (b) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, the
6 Administration shall establish a fee for the issuance of an identification card and for
7 issuance of a duplicate identification card.

8 (2) A fee is not required if the applicant for the card:

9 (i) Is 65 years old or older;

10 (ii) Is legally blind;

11 (iii) Has permanently lost the use of a leg or an arm;

12 (iv) Is permanently disabled so severely that the applicant cannot
13 move without the aid of crutches or a wheelchair; or

14 (v) Has a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits a
15 "major life activity" as defined in the federal Americans with Disabilities Act.

16 (c) A person may not commit any fraud in applying for an identification card
17 issued under this section.

18 (d) A person may not commit any misrepresentation in applying for an
19 identification card issued under this section.

20 (e) A person may not commit any fraud in using an identification card issued
21 under this section.

22 (f) A person may not make any misrepresentation in using an identification
23 card issued under this section.

24 (g) (1) An identification card shall be:

25 (i) Of the size and design that the Administration requires; and

26 (ii) Tamperproof, to the extent possible.

27 (2) The card shall contain:

28 (i) The name and address of the applicant;

29 (ii) The birth date of the applicant;

30 (iii) The sex of the applicant;

31 (iv) A description of the applicant;

1 (v) A color photograph of the applicant taken by the procedure that
2 the Administration requires. Photographs issued to applicants under 21 years of age
3 will be taken with the profile view. A fee, as established by the Administration, is
4 required for the conversion to a regular full face photo identification card after the
5 age of 21;

6 (vi) The expiration date of the identification card;

7 (vii) The signature of the applicant; and

8 (viii) The signature and seal of the issuing agent.

9 (h) An identification card may be used as legal identification of the individual
10 to whom it is issued for any purpose.

11 (i) An identification card expires every 5 years. It may be renewed on
12 application and payment of the fee required by this section.

13 (j) The identification card shall be surrendered by the holder upon being
14 issued a Maryland driver's license.

15 (k) The Administrator may issue an identification card to an applicant:

16 (1) [whose] WHOSE privilege to drive has been refused, cancelled,
17 suspended, or revoked; OR

18 (2) WHO HAS BEEN ISSUED A TEMPORARY LICENSE UNDER §
19 16-205.1(B)(3)(III) OF THIS ARTICLE.

20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
21 October 1, 2000.
