1 AN ACT concerning

World War II Memorial Fund

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Governor to include a certain amount in the State

4 budget of a certain fiscal year to the Department of Veterans Affairs, to be

5 donated by the Department to the World War II Memorial Fund; and generally

6 relating to the World War II Memorial Fund.

Preamble

8 WHEREAS, Currently, there exists no national memorial dedicated to those 9 United States citizens who served during World War II; and

WHEREAS, Sixteen million people served in the Armed Forces of the U.S.during World War II, including 250,000 residents of Maryland; and

WHEREAS, 406,000 Americans died fighting for their country during WorldWar II; and

14 WHEREAS, The citizens of the United States contributed and sacrificed as a 15 nation to support the troops abroad; and

WHEREAS, A national World War II Memorial Fund has been established toraise money for the construction of the first World War II Memorial in the UnitedStates; and

1 WHEREAS, The citizens of Maryland will have a unique opportunity to enjoy

2 the benefits of the Memorial, due to the close proximity of its future location,

3 Washington, D.C.; and

4 WHEREAS, The citizens of all states deserve to create a lasting reminder of 5 friends and family members who gave their lives in World War II so that future 6 generations might be free; now, therefore,

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
MARYLAND, That the Governor shall appropriate \$250,000 in the State budget for
fiscal year 2001 to the Department of Veterans Affairs. The Department shall donate
the appropriation to the World War II Memorial Fund located at 2300 Clarendon
Boulevard, Suite 501, Arlington, Virginia, 22201.

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 13 July 1, 2000.
