17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article - Education

20 5 203.

21 (a) In this section, "Agency" means the State Retirement Agency.

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1 (b)(1)The Agency may at any time examine the records of local school 2 systems to determine whether the State's payments for retirement contributions for 3 employees of the school systems are in accordance with the provisions of Division II of 4 the State Personnel and Pensions Article. IN MAKING THE DETERMINATION UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS 5 (2)SUBSECTION, THE AGENCY SHALL INCLUDE AS EMPLOYEES ELIGIBLE FOR STATE 6 7 PAYMENT OF RETIREMENT CONTRIBUTIONS THOSE EMPLOYEES: 8 Ð WHOSE SALARIES ARE PAID BY THE PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY 9 BOARD OF EDUCATION THROUGH FUNDING OF THE MAGNET SCHOOLS PROGRAM AS 10 PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET; AND 11 (II) WHO ARE MEMBERS OF THE TEACHERS' PENSION SYSTEM OR 12 TEACHERS' RETIREMENT SYSTEM. 13 If an examination of the records of a local school system shows (c) (1)(i) 14 that the State has paid more than is required under Division II of the State Personnel and Pensions Article, within 30 days after the date of the notice to the school system 15 of the State overpayment, the school system may appeal the notice of State 16 overpayment to the Secretary of Budget and Management who shall appoint a 17 18 hearing examiner who is an attorney. 19 The hearing examiner shall make recommendations to the (ii) 20 Secretary of Budget and Management who shall make a determination regarding the 21 amount, if any, of the State overpayment.

22 (iii) Should a local school system request a transcript of an audit
 23 appeals hearing, the local school system shall provide and pay for the production of
 24 the transcript.

25 (2) At the request of the Department of Education the moneys owed shall
 26 be deducted from any other State funds that would otherwise be paid to the school
 27 system if:

28 (i) <u>A local school system does not appeal to the Secretary of Budget</u>
 29 and Management or to the Office of Administrative Hearings; or

30 (ii) The Office of Administrative Hearings determines that the
 31 State is due reimbursement for excess payments as provided in paragraph (3) of this
 32 subsection.

33 (3) (i) The local school system may appeal to the Office of

34 Administrative Hearings a determination by the Secretary of the Department of

35 Budget and Management regarding the amount, if any, of the State overpayment.

36(ii)Within 45 days after the close of the hearing record, the Office37of Administrative Hearings shall issue a written decision to the parties and may grant

38 any appropriate remedy.

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1(iii)The written decision issued by the Office of Administrative2Hearings is the final finding of fact and conclusion of law and binding on all parties3and is not subject to judicial review.

4 (d) Any reimbursements which result from audits under this section:

5 (1) Shall be applied first to reimburse the Agency for the expenses of the 6 audits; and

7 (2) After reimbursement to the Agency under item (1) of this subsection,
8 shall be credited to the General Fund the State Retirement Agency shall include as
9 employees eligible for State payment of retirement contributions, in making a
10 determination under § 5-203 of the Education Article, those employees:

11 (1) whose salaries are paid by the Prince George's County Board of

12 Education through funding of the Magnet Schools Program as provided in the State
 13 budget; and

14(2)who are members of the Teachers' Pension System or the Teachers'15Retirement System.

16 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be

17 construed retroactively and shall be applied to and interpreted to affect retirement

18 contributions to be made on or after July 1, 1999.

19 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect

20 July June 1, 2000. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 month and, at the end of

21 June 30, 2000, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall

22 be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

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
