18	(a) [A] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, A local authority may not issue a residential parking permit to the owner of a vehicle to be valid for a period in excess of 30 days unless the owner provides satisfactory evidence that:
20 21	(1) The vehicle for which the parking permit is sought is registered in the State; or
22 23	(2) The owner of the vehicle has obtained under § 13-402.1 of this article:
24	(i) A nonresident permit; or
25	(ii) A complimentary guest card.

- 1 (b) NOTWITHSTANDING SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION, A LOCAL 2 AUTHORITY MAY ISSUE A RESIDENTIAL PARKING PERMIT TO A RESIDENT WHO IS A
- 3 DRIVER OF A VEHICLE NOT REGISTERED IN THE STATE IF:
- 4 (1) THE VEHICLE IS REGISTERED BY THE OWNER OF THE VEHICLE IN A 5 STATE IN WHICH THE RESIDENT IS EMPLOYED ON A REGULAR BASIS;
- 6 (2) THE RESIDENT DRIVER REGULARLY COMMUTES TO WORK IN THE 7 VEHICLE; AND
- 8 (3) THE OWNER OF THE VEHICLE IS THE RESIDENT'S EMPLOYER.
- 9 (C) If a residential parking permit area is established as a result of the 10 construction of a professional sports facility that seats 45,000 or more people, a local 11 authority may not charge a fee for the issuance of a permit to park in that area.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 13 October 1, 2000.
