BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 6 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 7 **Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages** 8 4-101. 9 In the jurisdictions listed in this section, "light wine" is a fermented 10 beverage that contains not in excess of 14 percent of alcohol by volume unless another 11 percentage is listed. 12 (1) Frederick County 21 PERCENT. 13 4-201. 14 A Class A light wine license may be issued only in: (a) 15 (1) Baltimore County; 16 (2) Carroll County; Dorchester County; 17 (3) 18 (4) Frederick County; 19 (5) Garrett County; 20 (6) Harford County; 21 Montgomery County; (7) 22 (8) Somerset County; 23 (9) Talbot County; and 24 (10)Washington County. 25 The license authorizes the holder to keep for sale and to sell light (d) (1) 26 wines produced at the winery in any quantity to any consumer at retail at the place 27 described in the license. The light wine shall be delivered in a sealed package or 28 container which may not be opened or the contents consumed on the licensed 29 premises. 30 In Montgomery County the licensee may not make more than 20,000
- 30 (2) In Montgomery County the licensee may not make more than 20,000 31 gallons of on-premises sales per year.
