- 4 (G) (H) (1) AN APPLICANT FOR A FRESHWATER FISHING LICENSE THAT
- 5 WILL BE USED IN TIDAL WATERS MUST DEMONSTRATE TO THE DEPARTMENT THAT
- 6 THEY HAVE THE APPLICANT HAS OBTAINED THE APPROPRIATE FEDERAL LICENSES.
- 7 (2) IN ADDITION TO ANY LICENSE REQUIRED BY THIS SECTION, A
- 8 PERSON MAY NOT FURNISH ANY SERVICE AS A FISHING GUIDE THAT REQUIRES
- 9 OPERATING A BOAT OR VESSEL AS PART OF THAT SERVICE WITHOUT COMPLYING
- 10 WITH APPROPRIATE FEDERAL REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE OPERATION OF A
- 11 VESSEL CARRYING PASSENGERS FOR HIRE.
- 12 (H) (I) The Department shall adopt regulations necessary to implement this
- 13 section <u>INCLUDING REGULATIONS THAT:</u>
- 14 (1) PROHIBIT A PERSON FROM FURNISHING ANY SERVICE AS A FISHING
- 15 GUIDE THAT REQUIRES OPERATING A BOAT OR VESSEL AS PART OF THAT SERVICE
- 16 WITHOUT COMPLYING WITH APPROPRIATE FEDERAL REGULATIONS GOVERNING
- 17 THE OPERATION OF A VESSEL CARRYING PASSENGERS FOR HIRE;
- 18 (2) LIMIT TO 150 THE NUMBER OF FRESHWATER FISHING GUIDE
- 19 LICENSES THAT WILL BE ISSUED ANNUALLY THAT ALLOW A PERSON TO OPERATE IN

- 30 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before December
- 31 1, 2003, the Department of Natural Resources shall report to the Governor, the
- 32 Senate Economic and Environmental Affairs Committee, and the House
- 33 Environmental Matters Committee, subject to § 2-1246 of the State Government
- 34 Article, on:
- 35 (1) the tidal and nontidal waters that are being fished by freshwater
- 36 fishing guides; and
- 37 (2) the types and numbers of fish that are being caught by recreational
- 38 anglers guided by freshwater fishing guides; and

- 1 (3) the number of freshwater fishing guide licenses issued that allow a 2 person to operate in nontidal freshwater and tidal areas designated in this Act.
- 3 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 4 June 1, 2000 is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of
- 5 the public health and safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by
- 6 three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General
- 7 Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
