#### Natural Gas Suppliers - Licensing and Consumer Protection

SUBTITLE 6. NATURAL GAS SUPPLIER LICENSING AND CONSUMER PROTECTION.

16 THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND DECLARES THAT THE PURPOSE OF THIS 17 SUBTITLE IS TO:

(B) THE COMMISSION SHALL CONSULT WITH THE CONSUMER PROTECTION
DIVISION OF THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL BEFORE ADOPTING
REGULATIONS DESIGNED TO PROTECT CONSUMERS OF GAS SUPPLY AND GAS
SUPPLY SERVICES.

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(C) THE PEOPLE'S COUNSEL HAS THE SAME AUTHORITY IN LICENSING,
 COMPLAINT, AND DISPUTE RESOLUTION PROCEEDINGS AS THE PEOPLE'S COUNSEL
 HAS UNDER SUBTITLE 5 OF THIS TITLE AND TITLE 2 OF THIS ARTICLE.

4 (D) IN CONNECTION WITH A CONSUMER COMPLAINT OR COMMISSION
5 INVESTIGATION UNDER THIS SUBTITLE, A GAS SUPPLIER SHALL PROVIDE TO THE
6 COMMISSION ACCESS TO ANY ACCOUNTS, BOOKS, PAPERS, AND DOCUMENTS THAT
7 THE COMMISSION CONSIDERS NECESSARY TO RESOLVE A MATTER IN DISPUTE.

9 THE COMMISSION MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS OR ADOPT ORDERS TO
10 IMPLEMENT THIS SUBTITLE THAT IT CONSIDERS NECESSARY AND IN THE PUBLIC

13 THIS SUBTITLE MAY BE REFERRED TO AS THE "NATURAL GAS SUPPLIER14 LICENSING AND CONSUMER PROTECTION ACT OF 2000".

15 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That gas suppliers doing

16 business in the State before the effective date of this Act shall be required to obtain a

17 license from the Commission under Title 7, Subtitle 6 of the Public Utility Companies

18 Article, as enacted by this Act, on or before July 1, 2001.

19 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That contracts between gas

20 suppliers and customers entered into before the effective date of this Act are not

21 subject to orders or regulations adopted by the Commission under § 7-604 of the

22 Public Utility Companies Article, as enacted by this Act.

23 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 24 July 1, 2000.

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
