A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Washington County - Museum of Fine Arts - Board of Trustees**

3 FOR the purpose of creating certain positions as a part of the Washington County
4 Museum of Fine Arts Board of Trustees; eliminating the set number of members
5 on the Board; and generally relating to the Washington County Museum of Fine
6 Arts Board of Trustees.

7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

10 Article 22 - Public Local Laws of Maryland
11 (1991 Edition and December 1997 Supplement, as amended)
12 (As enacted by Chapter 237 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1998)

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article 22 - Washington County**

16 12-102.

17 (a) There is a Board of Trustees of the Washington County Museum of Fine
18 Arts.

19 (b) The Board consists of [18 trustees as follows] THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS:

20 (1) 15 trustees appointed by the Board;

21 (2) As an ex officio member, the President of the Board of County
22 Commissioners or a County Commissioner designated by the President;

23 (3) As an ex officio member, the Superintendent of Schools of
24 Washington County; [and]

25 (4) As an ex officio member, the Mayor of the City of Hagerstown or a
26 City Council member designated by the Mayor;

1 (5) AS AN HONORARY MEMBER, A FORMER TRUSTEE RECOGNIZED FOR
2 EXCEPTIONAL SERVICE TO THE MUSEUM, APPOINTED BY THE BOARD; AND

3 (6) AS TRUSTEE EMERITUS, A FORMER TRUSTEE WHOSE ADVICE AND
4 COUNSEL IS CONSIDERED CRITICAL TO THE OPERATION OF THE MUSEUM,
5 APPOINTED BY THE BOARD.

6 (c) The Board may appoint up to six additional trustees.

7 (d) (1) Each trustee serves for a term of 5 years.

8 (2) The terms of the trustees are staggered as required by the terms of
9 the trustees serving on July 1, 1988.

10 (3) A trustee serves only for the remainder of a term if the trustee is
11 appointed:

12 (i) To fill a vacancy in an unexpired term; or

13 (ii) To succeed a trustee who is holding over.

14 (4) A trustee serves until the successor of the trustee is appointed and
15 qualifies.

16 (e) On taking office, each trustee shall take the oath required by Article I, § 9
17 of the Maryland Constitution.

18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
19 October 1, 2000.
