#### **Bicycle and Pedestrian Access 2001**

3 FOR the purpose of altering certain requirements relating to the State's Consolidated

4 Transportation Program to require inclusion of certain information concerning

5 pedestrians; stating certain findings of the General Assembly and declaring

17 article, the appropriation may not be restored for the same purpose as originally

18 proposed by the budget amendment procedure of § 7-209 of the State Finance and

19 Procurement Article or otherwise unless the General Assembly, in striking or

20 reducing the appropriation, expressly authorized its restoration.

21 (3) (i) During the period of fiscal years 1988 through 1992 as included

22 in the annual State report on transportation, the Department shall utilize all of its

23 share of the revenues attributable to the 5 cent increase of the motor fuel tax under

24 the provisions of Chapter 291 of the Acts of 1987 and credited to the Transportation

25 Trust Fund under § 2-1104 of the Tax - General Article and the proceeds of any

26 increased indebtedness based on that revenue and credited to the Transportation

27 Trust Fund to fund Department projects for the construction, reconstruction, and

28 rehabilitation of the State highway system.

29 (ii) During the period of fiscal year 1988 through fiscal year 1992
30 the total level of State funds appropriated to the State Highway Administration for
31 construction, reconstruction and rehabilitation of the State highway system,

32 including the revenues referred to in subparagraph (i) above, shall be at least 70
