- 3 FOR the purpose of clarifying the practice responsibilities of an optometrist; altering
- 4 restrictions placed on the practice of optometry; allowing for the waiver of
- 5 certain educational requirements for certain optometrists; altering provisions
- 6 relating to the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene to establish certain
- 7 guidelines and adopt certain regulations relating to optometrists and optometric
