A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **African-American Male Oral Cancer Initiative**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Office of Oral Health in the Department of Health
4 and Mental Hygiene to establish an African-American Male Oral Cancer
5 Initiative; requiring the Office of Oral Health to perform certain functions under
6 the Initiative to increase prevention, detection, and treatment of oral cancer
7 among African-American men; requiring the Department to obtain funding for
8 the Initiative from the Cigarette Restitution Fund; and generally relating to the
9 African-American Male Oral Cancer Initiative.

10 BY adding to

15 WHEREAS, Between 1973 and 1992, the incidence of oral cancer in the United
16 States increased 21.1% among African Americans as opposed to 8.3% in whites, while
17 the mortality rate decreased in the general population but increased 10.9% in
18 African-American males;

19 WHEREAS, In Maryland the mortality rate for oral cancer among African
20 Americans is 75% higher than among African Americans in the United States as a
21 whole;

22 WHEREAS, Early detection is associated with longer survival; and

23 WHEREAS, Tobacco use is implicated in 75% of all oral cancers in the United
24 States; now, therefore,

25 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
26 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Health - General

2 18-305.

3 (A) THE OFFICE OF ORAL HEALTH SHALL ESTABLISH AN AFRICAN-AMERICAN
4 ORAL CANCER INITIATIVE TO PROMOTE SCREENING, EARLY DIAGNOSIS, AND
5 TREATMENT OF ORAL CANCER IN AFRICAN-AMERICAN MEN.

6 (B) UNDER THE INITIATIVE, THE OFFICE OF ORAL HEALTH, IN
7 CONSULTATION WITH DENTAL PROVIDERS SERVING AFRICAN-AMERICAN MEN,
8 SHALL:

9 (1) INVESTIGATE THE PREVALENCE OF ORAL CANCER AMONG
10 AFRICAN-AMERICAN MEN AND IDENTIFY RISK FACTORS THAT MAY EXPLAIN THE
11 CORRELATION;

12 (2) DEVELOP EDUCATIONAL CAMPAIGNS AND OTHER STRATEGIES TO
13 PREVENT THE DISEASE AND REDUCE THE RISK FACTORS AMONG
14 AFRICAN-AMERICAN MEN;

15 (3) EXPAND MEDICAL COVERAGE AND ACCESSIBILITY OF ORAL CANCER
16 SCREENING AND EARLY DETECTION METHODS FOR AFRICAN-AMERICAN MEN;

17 (4) INCREASE ACCESS OF AFRICAN-AMERICAN MEN TO ORAL CANCER
18 TREATMENT; AND

19 (5) ENGAGE IN OTHER ACTIVITIES THAT REDUCE THE INCIDENCE AND
20 IMPACT OF ORAL CANCER AMONG AFRICAN-AMERICAN MEN.

21 (C) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL OBTAIN FUNDING FOR THE INITIATIVE FROM
22 THE CIGARETTE RESTITUTION FUND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 7-317(F)(1)(VIII) OF THE
23 STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE.

24 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
25 October 1, 2000.
