13 (A) THERE SHALL BE A SUBSTANCE ABUSE TREATMENT OUTCOMES

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, for the Substance Abuse Treatment Outcomes Partnership Fund established under this Act, the Governor shall include in the State budget for fiscal years 2002, 2003, and 2004 at least \$12.5 million each year for the Substance Abuse Treatment Outcomes Partnership Fund established under this Act, the following amounts to be distributed and managed in accordance with this Act:
