- 33 census and the date of the immediately preceding census, and the political
- 34 subdivision can demonstrate to the Secretary's satisfaction that either chronic
- 35 abandonment or demolition of property is occurring in that area or substantial
- 36 property tax arrearages exist within that area.

- 20 RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNOR AND, SUBJECT TO § 2-1246 OF THE STATE
- 21 GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1,
- 22 2000.
- 23 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 2 of this Act shall
- 24 take effect July 1, 2000. It shall remain effective for a period of 6 months and, at the
- 25 end of December 31, 2000, with no further action required by the General Assembly,
- 26 Section 2 of this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
- 27 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except as provided in
- 28 Section 3 of this Act, this Act shall take effect October 1, 2000.
