18 (2) Notice of any delegation of authority made under this section shall be19 published in the Maryland Register.

20 (3) The EMS Board may not delegate its authority to promulgate and 21 revise regulations, hear contested cases, or designate the provider review panel to the 22 Executive Director or the Institute.

23 (4) The EMS Board may delegate to the Office of Administrative24 Hearings the authority to hear contested cases and issue recommendations.
