WHEREAS, Recent brain research confirms that the most rapid brain growthoccurs in the first three years of life; and

WHEREAS, A stimulating environment is essential to brain development and has a major impact on a child's language and cognitive and emotional development; and

WHEREAS, The overwhelming evidence suggests that it is best to capitalize on the brain's elasticity before age 5, the age at which public education is guaranteed; and

31 WHEREAS, High quality early care and education programs make a significant 32 contribution to the development of skills required by young children to succeed in 33 school; and

34 WHEREAS, Not all Maryland children have access to quality early care and 35 education programs; and

WHEREAS, There is an imperative need to improve access to quality early careand education programs through collaborative partnerships; and

WHEREAS, Judith P. Hoyer dedicated her life to the education and care ofyoung children and their families; now, therefore,
