	CHAPTER
1	AN ACT concerning
2	State Employees - Compensation for Work Performed by Essential
3	Employees During Hurricane Floyd
4	FOR the purpose of providing that essential employees of any principal unit or
5	independent agency of the Executive Branch of State government who, due to
6	the weather-related emergency resulting from Hurricane Floyd, were required
7	to report to work in certain counties on a certain date shall be entitled to receive
8	certain compensatory time or additional pay for the hours worked during the
9	weather-related emergency situation; requiring the principal unit or
10	independent agency that employs an essential employee entitled to
11	compensatory time or additional pay to calculate the amount of compensatory
12	time or additional pay earned by the employee and credit the compensatory time
13	or pay the additional amount to the employee no later than a certain time;
14	providing for the funding for any payments under this Act; and generally
15	relating to the compensation of essential State employees in the Executive
16	Branch of State government.
17	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
18	MARYLAND, That essential employees of any principal unit or independent agency of
19	the Executive Branch of State government who, due to the weather-related
20	emergency resulting from Hurricane Floyd, were required to report to work in Anne
	Arundel, Cecil, Harford, or Kent County on September 16, 1999, during the full-day
	closing period of 6:00 a.m. to the end of the day shift, shall be entitled to receive
	compensatory time or additional pay, as appropriate, under the regulations and
	policies concerning work hours and overtime. These employees shall be credited with
	two hours of work time for each hour actually worked during the weather-related
26	emergency situation.

- 1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the principal unit or
- 2 independent agency that employs an essential employee entitled to compensatory
- 3 time or additional pay under Section 1 of this Act shall calculate the amount of
- 4 compensatory time or additional pay earned by the employee and credit the
- 5 compensatory time or pay the additional amount to the employee no later than 30
- 6 days after the effective date of this Act.
- 7 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That any payment due under
- 8 this Act shall be funded from the Catastrophic Event Fund in the State Reserve Fund.
- 9 As provided in § 7-324 of the State Finance and Procurement Article, the Governor is
- 10 authorized to transfer funds, after notice to and approval by the Legislative Policy
- 11 Committee, from the Catastrophic Event Fund to the expenditure accounts of the
- 12 appropriate State agencies to fund this Act.
- 13 <u>SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED,</u> That this Act shall take effect
- 14 July 1, 2000.
