4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Department of Natural Resources to establish a

- 5 program to study the impact of recreational watercraft on submerged aquatic
- 6 vegetation beds; requiring the Department to designate certain submerged
- 7 aquatic vegetation beds for the study; requiring the Department to take certain
- 8 actions to mark designated submerged aquatic vegetation beds; requiring the
- 9 study to make certain evaluations; authorizing the Department to adopt certain
- 10 regulations; requiring the Department to make a certain report; defining certain
- 11 terms; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to the
- 12 impact of recreational watercraft on submerged aquatic vegetation.

- 23 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 24 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

In this section, "submerged aquatic vegetation" means a vascular or (a) 4 nonvascular hydrophyte, which is rooted or unrooted, that lies entirely beneath the

5 surface of the water, except for flowering parts in some species.

IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS 7 (A) (1)8 INDICATED.

9 (2)"STUDY" MEANS THE STUDY OF THE IMPACT OF RECREATIONAL 10 WATERCRAFT ACTIVITIES ON SUBMERGED AQUATIC VEGETATION BEDS.

11 (3)"SUBMERGED AQUATIC VEGETATION" HAS THE MEANING STATED IN 12 § 4-213(A) OF THIS SUBTITLE.

THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ESTABLISH A PROGRAM TO STUDY THE IMPACT 13 (B) 14 OF RECREATIONAL WATERCRAFT ACTIVITIES ON SUBMERGED AQUATIC 15 VEGETATION BEDS IN THE CHESAPEAKE BAY AND COASTAL BAYS.

THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DESIGNATE A MINIMUM OF THREE 16 (C) (1)17 SEPARATE SUBMERGED AQUATIC VEGETATION HABITATS WITHIN THE CHESAPEAKE 18 BAY AND COASTAL BAYS TO BE INCLUDED IN THE STUDY.

EACH DESIGNATED SUBMERGED AQUATIC VEGETATION HABITAT 19 (2)20 SHALL HAVE A MAXIMUM DEPTH OF 4 FEET.

21 THE DEPARTMENT SHALL CLEARLY MARK EACH DESIGNATED AREA (3) 22 WITH BUOYS.

23 (D) THE STUDY SHALL:

EVALUATE THE DIRECT IMPACT OF RECREATIONAL WATERCRAFT 24 (1)25 ACTIVITIES ON THE ECOLOGICAL VALUE OF SUBMERGED AQUATIC VEGETATION 26 BEDS; AND

EVALUATE THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THE DEPARTMENT'S ACTIVITIES 27 (2)28 DESIGNED TO MINIMIZE THE IMPACT ON SUBMERGED AQUATIC VEGETATION 29 HABITATS.

THE DEPARTMENT MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS TO ADMINISTER THIS 30 (E) 31 SECTION.

32 THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REPORT THE RESULTS OF THE STUDY TO THE (F) 33 GOVERNOR AND, SUBJECT TO § 2-1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, TO THE 34 GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2003.

- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 1
- 2 October 1, 2000. It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and, at the end of
 3 September 30, 2003, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this
 4 Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
