

- 14 (A) AN EMPLOYEE OF THE TOWN OF OAKLAND SHALL RECEIVE ONE-THIRD
- 15 OF THE SERVICE CREDIT FOR ELIGIBILITY SERVICE AND CREDITABLE SERVICE
- 16 PRIOR TO THE EFFECTIVE DATE IN THE AMOUNT OF THE EMPLOYEE'S CREDIT, AS
- 17 CERTIFIED BY THE TOWN OF OAKLAND AS OF THE EFFECTIVE DATE.
- 18 (B) IF AN EMPLOYEE OR A FORMER EMPLOYEE OF THE TOWN OF OAKLAND
- 19 BECOMES A MEMBER OF THE EMPLOYEES' PENSION SYSTEM AT ANY TIME AFTER
- 20 THE EFFECTIVE DATE, THE EMPLOYEE MAY NOT RECEIVE SERVICE CREDIT FOR
