- 3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Board of License Commissioners of Washington
- 4 County to issue a caterer's license to certain license holders; establishing a
- 5 certain caterer's license fee; authorizing the holder of a caterer's license to
- 6 provide alcoholic beverages to certain persons in a certain location; requiring
- 7 that a license holder provide food as well as alcoholic beverages for consumption;
- 8 authorizing a license holder to use the license only during certain times;
- 9 requiring a license holder to return alcoholic beverages after a catered event to
- a certain location; requiring that certain license holders give a certain notice to
- the Board of License Commissioners; increasing and altering certain alcoholic
- beverages license fees; establishing certain alcoholic beverages licenses and fees;
- establishing the hours certain licensees may sell alcoholic beverages on certain

#### **HOUSE BILL 1411** 1 Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages 2 6-708.1. 3 (A) THIS SECTION APPLIES ONLY IN WASHINGTON COUNTY. (B) THE BOARD OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS MAY ISSUE A CATERER'S 4 5 LICENSE TO A HOLDER OF A CLASS B OR POURING BEER, WINE AND LIQUOR LICENSE. 6 (C) THE ANNUAL LICENSE FEE IS \$500. 7 A CATERER'S LICENSE ISSUED UNDER THIS SECTION AUTHORIZES THE (D) 8 HOLDER TO PROVIDE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES TO SPONSORS OF PUBLIC OR PRIVATE 9 EVENTS THAT ARE HELD OFF THE CLASS B OR POURING BEER, WINE AND LIQUOR 10 LICENSE PREMISES; AND 11 (E) THE HOLDER OF A CATERER'S LICENSE SHALL PROVIDE FOOD AS WELL AS 12 ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES FOR CONSUMPTION AT THE CATERED EVENT. 13 A HOLDER MAY EXERCISE THE PRIVILEGES UNDER THIS LICENSE ONLY 14 DURING THE HOURS AND DAYS THAT ARE PERMITTED FOR A CLASS B OR POURING 15 BEER, WINE AND LIQUOR LICENSE. A HOLDER SHALL RETURN ALL ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES THAT REMAIN 17 AFTER A CATERED EVENT ENDS TO THE HOLDER'S LICENSED PREMISES. 18 AT LEAST 10 DAYS BEFORE A CATERED EVENT, THE HOLDER OF A 19 CATERER'S LICENSE WHO IS CATERING THE EVENT SHALL GIVE WRITTEN NOTICE TO 20 THE BOARD OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS. THE NOTICE SHALL STATE: 21 (2) 22 (I) THE NAME AND ADDRESS OF THE PATRON; AND 23 (II)THE DATE, TIME, AND LOCATION OF THE CATERED EVENT. EACH CATERED EVENT SHALL BE OPEN TO INSPECTION BY THE 24 (3) 25 STAFF OF THE BOARD OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS. 26 7-101. 27 (t) (1) This subsection applies only in Washington County. 28 There is a special Class C (on-sale) beer, wine and liquor 29 license, which shall be issued solely to clubs having an annual on-sale beer, wine and 30 liquor license. This special license entitles the licensee to sell alcoholic beverages at 31 any place other than its regular place of business. 32 (ii) The license permits sales for a period not to exceed five days.

The daily fee is [\$30] \$50. [There is no fee on Sunday.]
